On-the-Job Training (OJT) Program

What is On-the-Job Training?

On-the-Job Training (OJT) is a program offered by the San Bernardino County Workforce Development Department to assist businesses in offsetting the training costs for new employees.

How does it work?

The County will reimburse a percentage of the wages paid, for a period of 3 months (depending upon the nature of the position and the skills gap), while the employee is trained in their new job. There is a limited amount of paperwork and record-keeping involved.

What are the primary requirements?

OJT Contract must be completed prior to hire date.

- Prior to the first day of work, the employer agrees to an arrangement with the County to train the new employee and the amount of reimbursement.
- The employer must provide proof of a business license, workers compensation and tax identification number.
- A record of the trainees payroll hours and a performance evaluation must be submitted at the end of the training (complete or incomplete) to receive reimbursement.

Example

- Your company pays the employee \$18.00 per hour
- Workforce Development reimburses \$9.00 per hour for up to 3 months (480 hours)
- Reimbursement Total: \$4,320.00
- Now, multiply that by 2, 3, or more employees!
