Research Job Leads:



Online Job Boards: Websites like Career Navigator, CalJOBS, Indeed, LinkedIn, Onet Online, and Glassdoor are excellent for finding current job openings. You can filter by location, industry, and job title to find relevant leads.



Company Websites: Visit the career pages of companies you're interested in. Many organizations post job openings directly on their websites.



Networking: Leverage your professional network. Reach out to contacts in your industry for potential job leads. Attend industry events, webinars, and join professional groups on social media platforms.



Recruitment Agencies: Consider registering with recruitment agencies that specialize in your field. They often have access to exclusive job listings and can match you with suitable positions.



University Career Services: If you're a recent graduate, utilize your university's career services. They often have job boards and can provide guidance on job searching.



Local Job Fairs: Attend job fairs in your area, particularly those hosted by local America's Job Center of California (AJCC). These events provide opportunities to meet with multiple employers in one place and learn about various job openings.

By using these methods, you can gather a comprehensive list of current job leads for the job titles or occupations you are interested in. Good luck with your job search! If you need more specific advice or resources, feel free to ask your Career Coach.

- Class schedule – What days and times are classes held? Will they fit into your current routine?
- Location – Is the training site easy for you to get to?
- Cost – What's the tuition, and are there any additional expenses not included?
- Job support – Does the provider offer help with job placement? What are their success rates?
- Employer connections – Which companies does the provider partner with for hiring?
